This is your chance to demonstrate your photography, creativity, and imagination in the Digital Slide Show competition to be presented at the meeting of April 6, 2020.

Don't miss this chance to experiment, learn new tricks and have some fun. The judges will consist of Club members and guests in the audience. Judges will be asked to consider how well the following elements work together to create an imaginative, entertaining and original presentation: theme, image quality, editing, story flow and pacing, music, sound effects and commentary, titles.

Rules:

- Your presentation may be on any subject of the photographer's choosing;
- An identifying title must be included:
- For this competition, the maker's name must NOT be included ANYWHERE in the presentation;
- The presentation must be no longer than four (4) minutes. It may be shorter;
- Submissions will be accepted by various methods: WeTransfer to slideshow@montrealcameraclub.com, or on a USB key with your name clearly indicated on the key:
- The file must be in .mov or .mp4 format,
- Presentations should be self-running (stand-alone, independent of the software used for its creation).

The presentation must be submitted to John Surridge no later than March 27, 2020 so that it may be tested and a judging list prepared. Please note that we no longer accept entries on the evening of the competition.

MCC PICTORIAL COMPETITIONS

There are five competitions held each year, two in the fall and three in the winter/spring. At the end of the season there is a competition for Image of the Year for the categories of Pictorial, Creative, and Photojournalism.

Pictorial – This refers to images that are deemed to consist of any material that is pictorial (aesthetic), documentary, patterns – a broad category of images generally acceptable as photographic, non-commercial material.



Creative – This category has now been split into two sub-categories for judging purposes. Any points earned in these two sub-categories are entered as Creative.

Images in both of these sub-categories are created using the same techniques, and are generally composites of several images.

While an Altered Reality (AR) image is understood to be fictional in subject matter, an Enhanced Reality (ER) image *appears* to be a single photograph taken of a real (not a fantastical) subject, and not a composite created using several images and techniques.

Photojournalism – This year we are following the CAPA guidelines which state that "Photojournalism relies on an image that tells a story or documents people affected by an event or a situation." The image should clearly make one point or convey a message. Good composition would greatly enhance the conveying of the story." Subjects may not be staged, and the use of editing is restricted to cropping, and tone and colour adjustment. The image must be a true representation of the captured subject.

Themes – There will be a Theme category in Pictorial Competitions #2 (Sports Photography), and #4 (Urban Decay). These images will be included in the 3 images maximum allowed to be submitted in each of these competitions.

Rules:

- Each photographer may enter a maximum of three (3) images per competition;
- Images previously entered in a Montreal Camera Club competition are NOT eligible;
- Digital images must be submitted to pictorial@montrealcameraclub.com by the deadlines established – see calendar on pages 20 and 21 for details:
- A maximum of ten (10) entries per year is allowed in any one category (Pictorial, Creative, and Photojournalism);
- One entry may be made for each Theme competition (that is, one entry in Pictorial competition #2, and one entry in Pictorial competition #4).

Sizing:

- Digital images should be submitted with a maximum width of 3840 pixels and/or a maximum height of 2160 pixels;
- Files should be saved as .jpg images with a high-quality setting.



MCC NATURE COMPETITIONS Charles Eklove

There are five competitions each year, two in the fall and three in the winter/spring. There are four categories in Nature: Botany, General, Zoology, and Ornithology. At the end of the season there is a competition for Image of the Year for each category.

Botany:

plants, trees, flowers, fundi, and lichen

General:

specific aspects of landscapes (e.g. wetlands), seascapes (e.g. tidal pools), rocks (e.g. basalt formations), fossils, stars, and planets



birds in their natural habitat

Zoology:

mammals, reptiles, amphibians, and insects in their natural environment

The hand of man MUST NOT appear in any Nature image entry – NO roads, houses, fences, or humans. NO cultivated plants such as tulips or daffodils. In the case of zoo animals, NO cage bars, concrete walls, zoo straw or bedding, mown grass, etc.

NOTE: banded birds, and pelicans on pilings ARE acceptable.

Titles are VERY important in Nature Competitions. They should correctly identify the subject by its common name or its species name (e.g. red sandstone cliffs - not just rocks, Jackass Penguin and not just Penguin, etc.).

MCC does not support baiting of birds or animals. Images made using baiting are ineligible for competition. Competition entries in which the subject(s) appear to have been baited should be accompanied by a note affirming that no baiting was used by the photographer or others present. 






Competition Submissions - Compulsory File Naming Rules QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE





The category you will be putting your entry into:

NG for General Nature, B for Botany, Z for Zoology, O for Ornithology NOTE: Any image in Nature is disqualified if there is any evidence of the HAND OF MAN.

The categories:

NG for General Nature:

i.e. geological features in landscapes, seascapes, etc., but the title should specify the aspect of nature depicted, e.g. granite Rocky Mountains, glacial moraine, tidal pools, boreal forest, etc.

B for Botany

i.e. main subject is a specific plant, mushroom, fungi, to trees or wildflowers. (no cultivated plants)

i.e. creature(s) as the main subject, insects to bison, starfish to whales (domestic animals prohibited)

O for Ornithology

i.e. birds only, in their natural habitat.

Digital images should be submitted with a maximum width of 3840 pixels and a maximum height of 2160

Please Note: ALL TITLES should be written without any underscores in the titles or all the words stuck together. Any entry not complying WILL BE RETURNED to the maker to make the proper adjustments to their titles. Updated: September 13, 2019

Rules:

- Each photographer may enter a maximum of three (3) images per competition:
- Images previously entered in a Montreal Camera Club competition are NOT eligible;
- Digital images must be submitted to nature@montrealcameraclub.com by the deadlines established - see calendar on page 20 and 21 for details:
- A maximum of ten (10) entries is allowed per year for any one category: Botany (B), General (NG), Ornithology (O), and Zoology (Z).

Sizing:

- Digital images should be submitted with a maximum width of 3840 pixels and/or a maximum height of 2160 pixels;





Updated: September 13, 2019

Rules:

- Prints with overall tone or colour throughout (e.g. sepia, selenium, etc.) are designated as Monochrome;
- Monochrome prints that have been selectively painted in a localized area are classified as colour, regardless of how small or large the area of colour;
- The entrant must be the maker of the original digital image. However, the resultant print may be commercially produced;
- Prints should be at least 9" on the long side and at least 8" on the short side of the image and matted to a maximum size of 16" x 20" (including the
- -Traditional mounting is required the top with a bevel-cut, placed on top of the print with rear protective support. "Flush-mounted" prints are not accepted;
- The number of prints submitted in any one year may not exceed a total of fifteen. Of the total prints, not more than seven (7) may be from any one category;
- Prints entered into the Theme competitions are in addition to the number of prints submitted to regular print competitions, and do not count towards the fifteen total for the regular competitions.



GEMBOREE COMPETITION RULES & QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE



Rules:

- Each photographer may enter a maximum of seven (7) images.
- No more than ONE (1) image may be entered in any one category.
- Images previously entered in a Montreal Camera Club competition are NOT eligible.
- Digital images must be submitted along with an entry form (refer below) to gemboree@montrealcameraclub.com

Sizing:

- Digital images should be submitted with a maximum width of 3840 pixels and a maximum height of 2160.
- Files should be saved as .jpg images with a high-quality setting. Resolution (pixels per inch) is not relevant for the digital images. Images will likely be between 1 and 5 MB each.
- Please keep your email size to less than 10 MB per email to avoid problems sending and receiving. If necessary, send your submissions in multiple emails.
- Images saved at 85% quality will likely retain almost all detail and will most likely be less than 2 MB each, depending on image content.

Judging Criteria:

- How well the image portrays the category theme
 - Impact
- Composition
- Technique
- · Maximum 10 points per image from each of 3 judges.

Note: Images NOT portraying the category theme may be disqualified.

flowers and plants (cultivated or wild), minerals, landscape (can include human elements)

Theme: Sport in Action

Any sport activity in any discipline. The subject must be in movement. It can be a frozen motion or a blurred motion.
